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From the Curator...





MISSOURI HISTORIC COSTUME & TEXTILE COLLECTION: SELF-PORTRAIT

September 2024 - February 2025

As part of Mizzou's first annual Arts After Hours event on September 13th sponsored by the College of Arts and Science, the MHCTC highlighted its unique varied collections including our Tiger Spirit Collection's Golden Girl uniforms; the Notable Missourians and Tigers Collection featured the legendary Ginger Rogers and Mizzou's only 4-star general John A. Gordon; student designs and dress highlighted TAM's state-of-theart apparel technologies and sustainable design strategies through our Made @ Mizzou: TAM Designs Collection; our Timely Response Collecting Strategy and Multicultural Dress, Designer, Diversity, and Household Textiles Collections are also highlighted. The exhibit is on display through February 22, 2025 in the Gwynn Hall Filippello Exhibition Showcase.

TAM 2280 PAST PATTERN FINAL PROJECT: 1960s!

This semester's inspiration for the final design project in TAM 2280 Apparel Production was the groovy 1960s and the MHCTC's grey striped shift dress shown here. This project is a unique opportunity for research and creative scholarship inspired by MHCTC apparel and archives. Graduate Instructor Mackenzie Miller measured the grey Gibson Girl dress to create a 3D digital pattern which students used to create garments inspired by the politics, art and culture of the 1960s.
